

Create for Climate Art Competition

Terms & conditions

By entering the Create for Climate Art Competition entrants accept these terms and conditions together with any specific instructions and terms for such competition which may be mentioned in any electronic messages, or on the website, or communicated to entrants in any other way ('competition information'). Such competition information shall prevail in the event of there being any inconsistency between these competition terms and conditions and any competition information.

British Council Netherlands and the British Embassy The Hague (hereinafter called 'the organisers') may cancel or amend any competition information, or these terms and conditions without prior notice. Any changes will be posted either within the competition information or these terms and conditions.

The Create for Climate Art Competition is part of the British Council's Climate Connection programme aiming to bring people around the world together to meet the challenges of climate change. Through arts and culture, education and the English language, it is about ideas, innovation and real change.

Competition Entry

The competition is open to residents of the Netherlands. The organisers may ask competition winners for proof of residency in the Netherlands and if a competition winner is unable to prove their residency to the organisers' satisfaction, the organisers reserve the right to select an alternative winner.

Entrants must be pupils in secondary education in the Netherlands from years 1-3 at VMBO, HAVO and VWO schools and pupils aged 12-15 at international and British schools in the Netherlands.

Each entrant must submit their entry with a complete Consent Form. A submission without an accompanying Consent Form will be invalid and will not be entered into the competition. Where the entrant is under the age of 18, the Consent Form must be completed by the parent/guardian of the child submitting the artwork. The organisers may ask for proof of age to verify the identity of that entrant at any time.

The competition will launch on 13 September 2021. It will close at 11.59pm on Sunday 17 October 2021. Any entries received before the opening and after the closing of the competition will be invalid and will not be entered into the competition.

Employees and members of their immediate families (including any live-in partner or household member) of any of the following may not enter: British Council Netherlands, British Embassy The Hague, Museon The Hague; any company involved in the organisation, management, promotion, or administration of the competition or its entry routes or donation of prizes or their agents or subsidiaries; any company involved in any capacity in the sponsorship of a competition or competition prize.

By entering the competition entrants warrant that all information submitted by them is true, current, and complete. Entrants also warrant that they are the copyright owners of any copyright works submitted, and the organisers use of such works (which you will permit) will not infringe the rights of any third party.

Only one competition entry can be submitted per entrant. Multiple children from the same household can submit one entry each to the Create for Climate art competition.

Entry to the competition may only be made via email to projects.nl@britishcouncil.org. The subject title of the entrance email must be 'Create for Climate – <Your Name>'. Any entries that do not copy that format will be invalid and will not be included in the competition. Please keep the original artwork until the competition winners are announced.

Any entries which are incomplete, incorrect, or not received by the organisers will be void.

In the event of any fault, mistake, misunderstanding or dispute concerning the correctness or acceptability of the entry or any answers given by entrants (if applicable), or the operation of any part of the competition network system, the decision of the organisers shall be final and no correspondence will be entered into.

The organisers will not be liable to reimburse expenses incurred in making an entry in any competition.

The full name, age, region of residence, and school's name, year and level of all entrants may be published by the organisers free of charge, and entrants grant to the organisers a non-exclusive licence to use and publish their entry, free of charge, in any media for the purpose of promoting the competition, showcasing a selection of entries and announcing the winners.

Prizes

The prize is as specified in the competition information.

The winners of the prize will be determined by a jury panel consisting of someone from the British Embassy The Hague, someone from British Council Netherlands and someone from Museon (hereinafter called 'partner venue') based on the creative merit of the artwork.

The organisers will attempt to notify the winners on 21 October 2021, or as otherwise indicated in the competition information. They will be contacted on the email address provided on the Consent Form when entering the competition. The winners will have a specified fixed time period in which to claim their prize. If the organisers are unable to notify a winner, or if a winner fails to respond within the fixed time period as specified, this may result in forfeiture of the prize and the organisers reserve the right to select an alternative winner in accordance with these terms and conditions and the competition information.

The festive opening of the exhibition and public announcement of the winners will take place on 28 October 2021 at Museon in The Hague.

Winners of the competition will be allowed to bring one parent or teacher along to the festive opening of the exhibition at the partner venue.

Winners of the competition agree for their submissions to be exhibited digitally on the Museon website. Winners should bring their artworks to the Museon on the festive opening day.

The organisers may in their sole discretion refuse to provide a prize, or seek its recovery, in the event of non-entitlement under these terms or an entrant's breach of these terms, fraud, dishonesty, or other inappropriate or improper conduct including but not limited to the use of technology which enables an entrant to evade charges or entry requirements.

Any entrant who enters or attempts to enter the competition in a manner, which in the organisers' determination is contrary to these terms and conditions or by its nature is unfair to other entrants may be removed from the competition at the organisers' sole discretion.

The organisers reserve the right to modify, cancel, terminate or suspend the competition in whole or in part, at their sole discretion, if they believe the competition is not capable of being conducted as specified in these terms and conditions or in the event of any other cause that is beyond the reasonable control of the organisers that could corrupt or affect the administration, security, impartiality, or normal course of the competition.

Privacy Notice for Create for Climate art competition

This privacy notice sets out how British Council Netherlands and the British Embassy The Hague (hereinafter called 'we' and 'the organisers') are processing personal data for the Create for Climate art competition.

This notice sets out how we will use your personal data, and your rights. It is made under the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

1. Overview

1.1 Who are we

The Create for Climate art competition is organised by British Council Netherlands and the British Embassy The Hague. The competition forms part of the British Council's Climate Connection programme aiming to bring people around the world together to meet the challenges of climate change. Through arts and culture, education and the English language, it is about ideas, innovation and real change.

Create for Climate is a unique art competition for children from across the Netherlands that aims to encourage children to capture their hopes and dreams for the planet in the future.

1.2 Your entry

If you enter the contest, we will ask you for your artwork, your full name, age, region of residence and school's name, year and level, and the full name, email address and telephone number of your parent or guardian.

We will also ask for your permission to publish your full name, age, region of residence, school's name, year and level, and art entry, and to announce the winners publicly.

If you agree to let us have those, we will use them to enter you into the contest and let you know if you win, or about any updates.

1.3 Keeping your information safe

We will protect the information you give us, and only share it with people that work for us, or who are judging the contest. The entrants' full name, age, region of residence, and school's name, year and level may be published along with their art if you give us permission.

The winning entries will continue to be on our internet sites until you ask us to delete it.

2. Your data

2.1 Purpose

The purpose for which we are processing your personal data is to raise awareness about the UN COP26 Climate Conference by holding a children's art competition. Entrants must be pupils in secondary education in the Netherlands from years 1-3 at VMBO, HAVO and VWO schools and pupils aged 12-15 at international and British schools in the Netherlands. All entries must be submitted with a complete Consent Form. This must be completed by the parent/guardian of the child submitting the artwork.

2.2 The data

We will process the following personal data: parent/guardian full name, parent/guardian email address, parent/guardian telephone number, entrant's full name, age, region of residence, school's name, year and level and the entrant's art.

2.3 Legal basis for processing

The legal basis for processing your information is agreement with our terms and conditions (contract) as described in the Create for Climate Art Competition Brief. The terms and conditions can also be found on [our website](#).

2.4 Recipients

Your personal data will be shared by us with the judges.

The entrants' full name, age, region of residence, school's name, year and level may be published by the organisers along with their art.

When entering, the entrants and their parent/guardian will be asked for consent to the publication, free of charge, in any media of the entrants' full name, age, region of residence, school's name, year and level,

and artwork. Where consent to publish is given, the parent is also granting to the organisers a non-exclusive licence to use and publish the entry in any media for the purpose of promoting the competition, showcasing a selection of entries and announcing the winners.

As your personal data will be stored on our IT infrastructure it will also be shared with our data processors who provide email, and document management and storage services.

2.5 Retention

Your personal data will be kept by us until six months after the exhibition closing date.

Information about the entrants and specified winners published on our social media feeds will be published indefinitely, or until you ask us to remove it.

Where personal data have not been obtained from you, your personal data were obtained by us from your parent or guardian.

3. Your rights

You have the right to withdraw consent to the processing of your personal data at any time.

You have the right to request information about how your personal data are processed, and to request a copy of that personal data.

You have the right to request a copy of any personal data you have provided, and for this to be provided in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format.

You have the right to request that any inaccuracies in your personal data are rectified without delay.

You have the right to request that any incomplete personal data are completed, including by means of a supplementary statement.

You have the right to request that your personal data are erased if there is no longer a justification for them to be processed.

You have the right in certain circumstances (for example, where accuracy is contested) to request that the processing of your personal data is restricted.

4. International transfers

As your personal data is stored on our IT infrastructure, and shared with our data processors, it may be transferred and stored securely outside the Netherlands. Where that is the case it will be subject to equivalent legal protection through the use of Model Contract Clauses.

5. Complaints

If you consider that your personal data has been misused or mishandled, you may make a complaint to the Autoriteit Persoonsgegevens, who is an independent regulator. The Autoriteit Persoonsgegevens can be contacted at:
