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Bringing Life Skills to Life with Dave Spencer

The basic concept of teaching Life Skills is simple - that our responsibility as educators is not only to help our students to learn English but also to prepare them for the challenges of life in the 21st Century. This talk will look at **why** the teaching of Life Skills is so important, particularly for teens, **which** life skills our students really need, and, arguably the most important question and the one that concerns teachers the most, **how** we can actually incorporate the teaching of Life Skills into our classes. To this end, the talk will include a number of practical activities, approaches and teaching materials. Some typical arguments against teaching Life Skills will also be addressed.



Preparation for First – what to focus on with Roy Norris

You're preparing students for the *Cambridge English*: First exam. There's a lot of ground to cover, so what language and skills should you give priority to? What advice can you give students? In this practical session, I'll address these questions using examples from the new coursebook Straight to First, as well as further supplementary materials I have designed for my own classes.



Pronunciation: The Cinderella of ELT with Adrian Underhill

Unlike grammar and vocabulary, pronunciation is not fully integrated into language learning. In this participatory and active workshop I will propose two solutions which I will then demonstrate in a hands-on lesson, showing how to liberate learners from the 'grip' of their mother tongue pronunciation, how to reconnect with the muscles that make the pronunciation difference. and how to feel greater confidence as the teacher. I will illustrate how to use the phonemic chart as a mental map in this process.



Word Perfect – The importance of recycling in vocabulary teaching with Dave Spencer

Vocabulary <u>teaching</u> can often appear relatively simple and straightforward, but unfortunately vocabulary <u>learning</u> by the students can seem frustratingly slow and difficult. In this session, we will investigate what it means to really 'know' a word, and what influence this has on how we should recycle and practise vocabulary in the classroom. We will also explore how memory works and the important implications that this can have for the design of recycling activities that genuinely help students to boost their word power. We will see a variety of practical classroom activities and strategies, the aims of which are to make vocabulary learning more effective, stimulating and enjoyable for our students.
